**BOARD REGULATION NO. 7
Series of 2021**

SUBJECT: AMENDING SECTION 11 (d) OF DDB REGULATION NO. 5, SERIES OF 2003, ENTITLED: GUIDELINES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF OPERATION: "PRIVATE EYE"

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9165, also known as the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002," as amended (the "Act"), provides that the Dangerous Drugs Board (the "Board") shall be the policy-making and strategy-formulating body in the planning and formulation of policies and programs on drug prevention and control. It shall develop and adopt a comprehensive, integrated, unified and balanced national drug abuse prevention and control strategy;

WHEREAS, in relation to Section 22, Article II of RA 9165, the Board exercising its powers as provided under Section 81 (b) of RA 9165, issued Regulation No. 5, Series of 2003, which provides for the Guidelines in the Implementation of Operation: "Private Eye." It is a project designed to give commensurate reward to any person providing information to law enforcers which results in the successful confiscation, seizure or surrender of dangerous drugs, plant sources of dangerous drugs, and precursors and essential chemicals and/or arrest of persons violating the penal provisions of RA 9165;

WHEREAS, the implementation of the Operation: "Private Eye," yielded affirmative result in favor of the government's anti-illegal drug campaign due to the influx of informants who reported illegal drug activities despite fear and apathy, taking into consideration their utmost confidentiality and anonymity;

WHEREAS, Section 11, paragraph (d) of Regulation No. 5, Series of 2003 laid down the reward schedule for the confiscation or recovery of Marijuana, Hashish Seeds wherein two percent (2%) of the DDB value of the confiscated/destroyed crops and its derivatives up to a maximum of Php 500,000.00 shall be given to informants who give information provided that the cultivator/planter is arrested;

WHEREAS, in order to make Operation: "Private Eye" more responsive to the dynamics of national and international drug situation and to the drug prevention and control campaign of the government, the Evaluation Committee agreed and proposed the amendment of Section 11 (d) of Regulation No. 5, Series of 2003 with due recognition on the bravery and courage of informants risking their life and limbs;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it **RESOLVED**, as it hereby **RESOLVED**, that Section 11 (d) of Board Regulation No. 5, Series of 2003 be amended and restated as follows:

"Section 11. Reward Schedule. - Unless otherwise revised by the Dangerous Drugs Board, the reward schedule shall be as follows:

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d. Confiscation or Recovery of Marijuana, Hashish Seeds

Ten percent (10%) of the prevailing value of the confiscated and/or destroyed crops and its derivatives up to a maximum of Php 500,000.00 shall be given to the informant whose information led to the successful eradication operation.

Five percent (5%) of the value of the confiscated and/or destroyed crops and its derivatives up to a maximum of Php 500,000.00 shall be rewarded to the informant whose information led to successful anti-illegal drug operation, other than eradication operation, provided that drug personality is arrested and case was filed.”

Section 12. Penalty Clause. - Any violation of this Regulation shall be penalized under Section 32 of RA 9165 without prejudice to any other administrative and criminal prosecutions, if warranted.

Section 13. Amending and Repealing Clause. - All issuances, including Board Regulation No. 5, Series of 2003 or part thereof inconsistent herewith, are deemed repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 14. Effectivity Clause. - This Regulation shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in two (2) newspapers of general circulation and after its registration with the Office of the National Administrative Register (ONAR), UP Law Center, Quezon City.
