

**An Evaluation of the Residential Treatment Program of Narcotics Group
(NARGROUP) Rehabilitation Center Using Stufflebeam's CIPP Model**

This study evaluated the residential treatment program for drug dependents of the Narcotics Group Drug Rehabilitation Center (NARGROUP) using Stufflebeam's Context, Input, Process, and Product (CIPP) Model. Based on the findings of the study, the goals of the residential treatment program was "satisfactorily attained" as perceived by the staff and parents. These goals premised on the needs of the drug dependents which is – the physical, mental as well as emotional, spiritual restoration and social rehabilitation as evidenced by the responses made by the staff on the focus group discussion. Since it was perceived as "satisfactorily attained", findings also implied that the goals of the residential treatment program were responsive to the needs of its clientele.

The study among others recommended that programs and services found not available in the center like laboratory services be provided. Likewise, the aftercare program that was perceived poorly utilized should be strengthened for a more effective treatment and rehabilitation of the recovering drug dependents.
